Michael Hollerbach, Penny Aviles, and the rest of the Life University WCCS chapter and convening team, thank you so much for all of the hard work, countless hours, and endless love you put into creating the space that hosted and facilitated such an incredible group of people. I would also like to say a special thank you to Life University, and especially to Dr. Guy Riekeman, for the sheer amount of support and resources that they provided for this event from start to finish.

This year's AGM in Atlanta was packed with events, and congress was very busy as usual, so below I will just touch on a few of the highlights.

We unanimously decided to begin the early steps of becoming a Non-Governmental Organization in official relations with the World Health Organization. We accepted one new school and one returning school into the WCCS membership, Texas Chiropractic College (TxCC) in Pasadena Texas has renewed its membership while Chiropraktik Akademie (CPA), associated with Dresden University in Dresden Germany, has become a member for the first time. And finally, after an incredible bid presentation, it was decided that the convener for the 2017 WCCS AGM will be Brandan Tong from Life Chiropractic College West (LCCW)! Brandan is planning on hosting near San Francisco in August 2017.

## WFC/ECU Convention Report

This year Athens hosted the 13<sup>th</sup> WFC (World Federation of Chiropractic) & ECU (European Chiropractors' Union) biannual convention from the 10-16<sup>th</sup> of April. The WCCS was represented at this event by their BOD members, the European Director Tone Granquist and the vice-president Damiano Costa. This was a great week filled with opportunities to interact and to gain experience. Several meetings took prior place to the convention, which the WCCS were invited to attend. The WCCS was also given the opportunity to present to the WFC assembly and the BOD of the WFC. Great interest and appreciation was shown in our aims to enhance the profession and the

communication between organizations.

The ICRC is an informal group that works on regulation and legislation of the profession on an international level (http://www.chiroregulation.org/).

During their meetings in Athens they spent the time sharing information about differences that exist among the international chiropractic regulatory bodies. Damiano Costa, as a member from the WCCS and its International Mobility Committee (IMC), was invited as an observer at the ICRC meetings and to present the progress of the IMC. They expressed interested in international mobility and chiropractic degree portability. Thanks to this, the IMC has the opportunity to be a member of the ICRC steering committee, which is a great achievement for the WCCS moving forward.

Tone Granquist was invited as an observer for the ECU meeting. This serves as an opportunity for European countries to come together and share their successes as well as challenges. This vital platform for communication helps aids resolution of challenges faced and encourages unity within the region. Country representatives gave an update and presentations, while several countries expressed plans to increase the number of Chiropractic institutions and the profession seems to be establishing itself more and more over European region, exciting news. which is Another presentation was then requested to be done about the WCCS with more focus on European region including time allocated to answer questions.

The WCCS representatives also met with the CCEI board, comprised of representatives from all the international accrediting bodies. This meeting was productive in sharing student perspectives on accreditation and to gain an understanding of the importance of studying at an accredited college. This was the first step for future collaborations.

In summary, this has been a huge opportunity for our corporation to show its presence at an international chiropractic convention. The WCCS provides a platform to develop future leaders of the profession and to stay connected with the current global chiropractic leaders, which is crucial for the development of the profession worldwide. We would like to take this opportunity to thank the WFC, the ECU, the ICRC and the CCEI for their invitations; we value and appreciate their consideration of our presence as a valuable global chiropractic student organization.

## **WHA Report**

The World Health Organization is the highest health policy setting body in the world. It is made up of 194 member states that send their health ministers to meet once per year at the World Health Assembly (WHA) in Geneva, Switzerland. Besides just the 194 member countries, there are also a large number of Non-Governmental Organizations in official relations with the World Health Organization, otherwise known as NGO's, who are represented in Geneva during the WHA.

The World Federation of Chiropractic is one of those NGO organizations. The WFC has very kindly extended some of the space in their delegation to members of the WCCS in recent years, and I want to personally thank the WFC, Mr. David Chapman-Smith, and Dr. Greg Steward for their support of chiropractors, chiropractic, and the WCCS! This year, 4 members of the WCCS served as delegates of the WFC. WCCS Vice President Dr. Damiano Costa, immediate past WCCS president Dr. Luke Schmidt, first year AECC student Christian Sentker, and myself, went to Geneva for a week in May this year to learn, network, and have our minds collectively blown on the world stage.

I can't help but to think that, more than many other things in life, your opinions and take-away from the WHA are highly dependent on your world view before going into the event. Imagine four chiropractic students, one from Germany, one from Italy, one from South Africa, and one from the United States. Imagine sitting those 4 people, all of similar age and profession, down around a table and you ask them to come up with a solution or plan for dealing with each of the world's major health concerns; communicable diseases (e.g. Ebola), non-communicable diseases (e.g. diabetes, Alzheimer's), pollution, sanitation, war refugees, poverty, mental illness, natural disaster relief, etc. Imagine all the different answers and arguments you might get.

Now instead of four people imagine there are thousands of people. And instead of just chiropractors, imagine those people representing every healthcare discipline on

the planet. Now also imagine that those people are not just from four countries on three continents, but from two hundred countries from nearly every major culture and background in the world.

Imagine all of those people, all of those backgrounds, all of those professions and careers! Now give those people the same job you gave the four students from earlier, to come up with a solution or plan for dealing with each of the world's major health concerns, including communicable diseases, lifestyle diseases, pollution, poverty, war, climate change, and natural disasters.

And now, finally, imagine that MOST of those people don't really have any idea what chiropractic is.

Now you may be able to begin to imagine what it was like to be at the WHA.

The scope and responsibility of the World Health Organization is massive, almost incomprehensible. Chiropractic's role may be very small in some of the big topics that the WHO is concerned with, like the thousands of medical workers who died trying to contain Ebola, or the 7 million people who die every year from air pollution exposure, but it is certainly should not be small in many other areas.

I am unsure where chiropractic will eventually fit into the world's health policy,

but I do know that our role will be much bigger than it is now. There are still billions

and billions of people around the world who have no idea that a chiropractic adjustment is even an option for their health, or for that of their families. How quickly these billions can get access to a chiropractor will be partially determined by the health policies set by the WHO and by individual governments. Right now, and in the foreseeable future, chiropractors who help educate policy makers about chiropractic, or chiropractors who become policy writers themselves, will be able to potentially impact millions more patients than they can

through private practice alone.




