



UIA ROUND TABLE DISCUSSION

21 NOVEMBER 2025

Hello everyone. I am going to talk about my experience at the Roundtable held in Brussels, Belgium, on November 21st.

The Union of International Associations (UIA) is a non-profit, non-governmental research institute that has been impartially documenting the nature and evolution of international civil society since its foundation. It strives to maintain one of the most comprehensive sources of information on international associations, their organizational structures, and their meeting activities. Its goal is to bring international associations together in order to support and promote global civil society cooperation.

We wanted to participate in this event to introduce who we are and to explore potential opportunities for collaboration with other organizations.

I also attended several conferences, including:

From Problem to Progress: Conflict as Creativity for International Organisations, presented by Dr. Gordon Barrett and Professor Daniel Laqua.

Dr. Gordon Barrett is a research fellow in history whose research focuses on the politics of science, technology, and medicine in modern East Asia, with particular interest in the role of non-state actors, from transnational activist networks to international organizations. Professor Daniel Laqua is a professor of modern and contemporary history and an associate professor at Newcastle University. He has published extensively and is well known in his field. He has also written about the UIA in one of his publications.

VAT and Related Issues Concerning International Associations, presented by Philippe Noirhomme and Fanny Meite from Ryan Tax Consulting.

Philippe Noirhomme is a certified tax adviser who works with Ryan Tax Consulting. He spent 11 years in a consulting department and authored a book on VAT in 2010.

Navigating the Changing Funding Landscape for Associations: Exploring Alternative Solutions, presented by Joost Visser and Jan Lichots. Joost Visser is the CEO and co-founder of TIAO, a Brussels-based service provider that supports individuals and organizations seeking to bring positive change to their communities.

WORLD SPINE DAY

16TH OCTOBER 2025

World Spine Day was a resounding success, marked by strong engagement and enthusiastic participation across numerous chapters worldwide. Many chapters actively took part in the celebrations and entered the competition, demonstrating a shared commitment to promoting spine health awareness and education within their communities.
